<u>Symptoms</u> –LM Space employees as well as vendors, are to self-check their symptoms prior to coming into the facility. <u>If a temperature of 100.4 is indicated, you are to contact your manager.</u> <u>If anyone feels they have been exposed to the virus they are to call their management immediately and wait for further instructions.</u>

Temperature checking stations are located at all Bay Area locations; B/520 Lobby in Santa Clara, B/202 in Palo Alto and the Visitors Center in Sunnyvale. If required to quarantine due to pending test results, you may be put on the KNDS charge number. There will be a symptom checking station in Santa Cruz; the company will be letting us know where that will be.

## Masks- Requirements to Wear Facial Coverings/Masks:

- It is generally expected that facial coverings be worn at all times, however, they can be temporarily removed when employees have at least six feet of physical separation.
- Facial coverings must be worn while onsite at any Lockheed Martin facility including but not limited to:
  - o Hallways, Breakrooms and restrooms, Conferences, and meeting rooms; during transit through and in the facility; anytime personnel are in a common area/spaces where others are present or will be expected to pass by such as Office areas, Manufacturing floors and Labs.

# SANTA CRUZ TEST BASE UPDATE

NASA Fire Information for Resource Management System; Cal Fire incidents web site

<u>Santa Cruz Test Base Update</u> –CZU Lightning Fire Complex - The acreage burned has maintained at 86,509 acres. The fire is now 91% contained and the structures destroyed has not increased above the 1490 structures reported previously, and the 140 structures damaged have also not been increased since the fire began on 8/16. The evacuation orders have been lifted.

SCTB Site Update- In addition to the escorting of subcontractors who are involved in the recovery effort, all of the employees from the SCTB have been deployed to Sunnyvale, Palo Alto and SCTB for the recovery effort. Some Sunnyvale employees may also be dispatched to help with the effort, they will be notified and directed by the company. Employees are led up to the SCTB by caravan with official escorts, however that may be ending soon. We were told that personal vehicles may be allowed later this week. I was notified late today that Felton Grade and Empire Grade road are safe to travel; Alba and Jameson are still restricted.

The company should have reached out to you on your assignment. Manufacturing, inspection and facilities should be reporting back to work in Santa Cruz this week as directed by the company. If in doubt, contact your management for direction. It was reported that power and water have been restored. The recovery process has progressed much faster than even I had hoped. Congratulations to our members who have helped in the effort.

It was reported that the Base is partially operational, however those working should not tour the countryside; employees should stay in the buildings they are assigned to since others may be still red tagged due to safety concerns. See the LM Notify attached and the Memo from Josh Hespeler.

<u>If you are required to purchase PPE such as but not limited to safety shoes</u> keep your receipts for reimbursment per the CBA.

Payment after review and approval may take from 7 to 10 days.
